## **PUBLIC HEARING**

Chair Yoder opened the Public Hearing at 7:05 pm

### **Z12-04 – Proposed Zoning Amendment Section 514 Vehicular Parking Space, Access and Lighting.**

The City of Manistee Planning Commission has reviewed Section 514, Vehicular Parking Space, Access and Lighting and proposes changes that include establishing a maximum number of parking spaces; reduces the number of parking spaces for multi-family units; changes the number of spaces for Hospitals, Nursing and Personal Care Facilities, Medical Clinics and Medical and Dental Offices, and Industrial and Warehouses; requires pedestrian walkways for parking lots with 10 or more spaces; establishes a 5 foot buffer (front property line); establishes Bike Parking for some uses; requires the installation of sidewalks in some districts for certain uses.

Denise Blakeslee, Planning & Zoning – This is the amendment that the Commission has been discussion for several months and includes minor changes that were made by the City Attorney.

Chair Yoder opened the hearing for public comments.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **Z12-04 – Proposed Zoning Amendment Section 514 Vehicular Parking Space, Access and Lighting.**

A public hearing was held earlier for a proposed Zoning Amendment to Section 514 of the Zoning Ordinance.

Motion by Ray Fortier, seconded by Linda Albee that the Planning Commission approves and recommends City Council's adoption of the Proposed Zoning Amendment Z12-04.

## **Ordinance Amendments**

### **Section 1813 Bed & Breakfast**

During the process of preparing the Ordinance Amendment to Re-Zone the Peninsula it was discovered that while Bed & Breakfast was listed as a Special Use in both the table of Uses and in Article 12 Waterfront, Section 1813 Bed and Breakfast Item B.h did not establish the number of units.

The Commission needs to establish the number of sleeping rooms rented to transient guests for both the WF District and the PD Peninsula District. The current language reads:

*h. The number of sleeping rooms rented to transient guests within a Bed and Breakfast Establishment shall not exceed the following standards:*

<i>Within the R-1:</i>	<i>4 sleeping rooms</i>
<i>Within the R-2, R-3:</i>	<i>5 sleeping rooms</i>
<i>Within the C-2, C-3 District:</i>	<i>6 sleeping rooms</i>

Discussion from Staff and the Commission was if the number of rooms is established by the size of the building and rooms and the amount of parking available to service the B&B why should the number of rooms be limited?

Motion by Eric Gustad, seconded by Linda Albee that Item B.h establishing the number of rooms for Bed and Breakfasts be deleted from the requirements of Section 1813 Bed and Breakfast.

## **Section 502 Uses, Spatial and Physical Requirements**

Over the past two years staff has had several requests from people who want to improve their property by constructing a new front porch with or without a roof. Typically they want it large enough to put out a chair or two or a swing to enjoy the outdoors. In many of the established neighborhoods, the homes already encroach into the front yard setback. When they come in for a permit staff has had to deny their request or they have to apply for a variance. Almost all of them have opted not to improve their home or just replace the worn out steps.

Denise Blakeslee, Planning & Zoning - discussed with the Commission if the Ordinance should be amended to allow the construction of porches and decks in the front yard setback, this would be done under Section 502 Uses, Spatial and Physical Requirements.

Ms. Blakeslee also discussed swing sets and if porches and decks should be excluded in the calculation for lot coverage.

Consensus from the Commission was that swing sets/play sets need to be defined and that no changes should be made to the lot coverage requirements.

Staff the drafted language that will be forwarded to the City Attorney for his review then brought back to the commission at their July meeting.

Commissioner Crockett asked who was the Project Manager for the Beach House and expressed his concern that arranging Porta-Potties in on both side of the walkway to the beach.

Jon Rose, Community Development Director – said that he was the Project Manager for the Beach Pavilion only, but would see what could be done about the arrangement of the Porta-Potties.
