Making Payments

The City of Manistee is committed to providing its residents convenient ways of transacting business with the city, including making payments both traditionally and electronically. Payments can be made at the City Hall treasurer counter during regular business hours. Types of payment accepted at City Hall are cash, check, money order and credit card. After hours, there is a drop box located on the west side of City Hall, lower level, in the door to the Police Department.



Water & Sewer Bills

We offer two ways to electronically process water and sewer payments. The most convenient is through the use of an auto-draft feature. You provide us with your financial information, and your monthly bill is automatically deducted from your account. No more missed payments! This is especially useful for seasonal residents and anyone else who wants one less thing to remember. To sign up, please return the auto debit enrollment form to City Hall.



The second method for paying is by credit card, either at the City Hall Treasurer counter or online. To pay online, please go to our online portal and <u>register or sign in.</u> Click here for <u>detailed instructions on how to register</u>. A convenience fee of 3% with a \$2.00 minimum applies to all credit card transactions.

Tax Bills

The City of Manistee collects property taxes in the summer and winter for itself and other taxing jurisdictions. Summer bills are due August 20. Winter bills are due February 14. All payments must be received in the city offices on or before the due date or they will be considered late. Postmarks are not accepted. After these dates, penalties and interest will apply. If you want a receipt, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with your tax payment. Please make checks payable to the City of Manistee.

The City of Manistee makes tax and assessing information available online. Taxes can also be paid online. To pay online, please go to our online portal and <u>register or sign in.</u>

If you are eligible, applications for summer and winter tax deferments can be obtained at City Hall.

Delinquent Real Property Taxes

Real property taxes are turned over as delinquent to Manistee County on March 1 and additional fees and penalties will apply. After this date, all taxes must be paid to:

Personal Property Taxes

Personal property taxes are levied on business non-inventory furniture, fixtures and equipment. Every business must annually file a personal property tax statement. If you do not file this statement, the assessor is required to estimate the value of this equipment. It is in your best interest to file this statement. Personal property taxes are delinquent as of March 1. The city collects delinquent personal property taxes. If these taxes are not paid, the city can seize the assets and sell them to pay the outstanding taxes.

Payments Not Processed by the City

There is frequently confusion about what types of bills can be paid at City Hall. Many times, residents confuse payments that are handled by Manistee County. The city does not accept payments for:
